The cluster unites projects that share a common vision of creating a more connected, data-driven, and climate-resilient agricultural sector. Alongside LandShift, AgRimate, AGRARIAN, EARTHONE, OpenAgri, Climate Farm Demo, and ENFORCE, NOSTRADAMUS is contributing to a coordinated effort to strengthen collaboration, promote knowledge exchange, and maximise the impact of European research and innovation.

Building Stronger Connections Across Europe

European agriculture is facing increasingly complex challenges, including climate change, biodiversity loss, fragmented data ecosystems, and the growing need for scalable digital solutions. Addressing these challenges requires cooperation across projects, disciplines, and stakeholder communities.

The AgroTech Hub Cluster was established to foster closer collaboration between complementary Horizon Europe initiatives by:

Launching a Collaborative Initiative



The cluster officially began its activities with its first synergy meeting, where representatives from all participating projects introduced their objectives, exchanged experiences, and identified common areas for collaboration.



During the meeting, partners jointly developed the foundations of the cluster, including its name and visual identity, and agreed on a programme of regular bi-monthly meetings to coordinate future activities and strengthen cooperation.

One of the first major initiatives agreed by the partners was the organisation of a joint webinar series focusing on topics of common interest, including artificial intelligence, edge computing, agricultural data ecosystems, interoperability, climate modelling, living labs, and digital innovation for sustainable agriculture.

From Data to Decisions

The first AgroTech Hub Cluster webinar, "From Data to Decisions: Building Europe's Next-Generation Agri-Data Ecosystem," took place online on 13 March 2026, bringing together experts from six Horizon Europe projects: NOSTRADAMUS, LandShift, AGRARIAN, OpenAgri, ENFORCE, and EARTHONE.

The webinar explored one of the key challenges facing modern agriculture: transforming the growing volume of agricultural data into practical, evidence-based decisions for farmers, advisors, land managers, and policymakers.



Speakers presented innovative approaches covering topics such as Earth Observation, AI-powered decision-support systems, land-use modelling, open-source digital platforms, environmental governance, and greenhouse gas monitoring. Discussions also addressed data interoperability, governance, usability, and the importance of connecting diverse data sources into integrated digital ecosystems capable of supporting sustainable agricultural practices.

The event demonstrated how collaboration between Horizon Europe projects can accelerate innovation while providing stakeholders with practical insights into the future of digital agriculture.
